The Fort de Chartres Winter Rendezvous featured 18th- and early 19th-century camp life and a woods walk among the weekend fun Nov. 1-2.

A few miles from Prairie du Rocher, Illinois, the site marks the location of the last of four successive French forts named "de Chartres," according to the fort's [website](#).

Built in 1753 by the French during the 18th-century colonization of the Illinois Country, the stone fort was preceded by three wooden forts. The first was erected in 1720. Fort de Chartres served as the French seat of government and its chief military headquarters in Upper Louisiana from 1753 until 1765 when it was occupied by the British.

In addition to the November event, the fort hosts a Colonial Market Fair in April, an annual rendezvous in early June and other other events.


